PREVENT TYPE 2 DIABETES WITH NATIONAL DIABETES PREVENTION PROGRAM

Registration is open for the next session of the National Diabetes Prevention Program offered by the Florida Department of Health in Santa Rosa County. The first class will be held Monday, January 30, from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Florida Department of Health in Santa Rosa County Milton office, 5527 Stewart Street. The registration fee is \$25.00 and includes classes led by a trained lifestyle coach, lab tests and a workbook. Participants may be referred by a primary care provider or self-refer by contacting Susan Howell at 850-564-2263 or Ashlee Turner at 850-564-2304 to register.

Led by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the program is based on research that showed that people with prediabetes who lost five to seven percent of their body weight (10 to 14 pounds for a 200-pound person) reduced their risk of developing Type 2 diabetes by 58 percent. Guided by a trained lifestyle coach, participants learn the skills they need to make lasting changes, such as losing a modest amount of weight, being more physically active and managing stress.

Participants learn how to eat healthy, add physical activity to their routine, manage stress, stay motivated, and solve problems that can get in the way of their success. Classes meet once a week for 16 weeks, then once a month for 6 months to maintain healthy lifestyle changes. The program's group setting provides a supportive environment with people who are facing similar challenges and trying to make the same changes. Together, participants celebrate their successes and find ways to overcome obstacles.

People are more likely to have prediabetes or Type 2 diabetes if they:

- Are 45 years of age or older.
- Are overweight.
- Have a family history of Type 2 diabetes.
- Are physically active less than three times per week, or
- Have been diagnosed with gestational diabetes during pregnancy, or
- Gave birth to a baby weighing more than 9 pounds.

"The complications from Type 2 diabetes are serious and can include heart attacks, stokes, blindness, kidney failure, and the amputation of toes, feet or legs," said Barbara McMillion, RN, Director of Nursing for the Florida Department of Health in Santa Rosa County. "Small changes can make a big difference. This program can help those with prediabetes make the lasting changes they need to prevent diabetes and its complications and improve their quality of life."

Use of barricades policy: Free to parades and other events in Santa Rosa County that are sponsored by a chambers or government entities (Christmas parades, Mardi Gras, 4th of July etc...) or non profits, that are hosting events that are free and open to the public. The user is responsible for transportation of barricades, AND banners advertizing sponsors MUST be put on barricades. Others wanting to use the barricades must provide transportation and rent barricades at a cost of \$5 per barricade. Additional fees may be applicable if barricades are not returned within 7 days of pick up/delivery. Barricades will cost \$8 each if delivery is required. Average rental price for barricades is \$9-\$13 each through other vendors. SAFER barricades are a bargain.

NEW ONLINE COURSE: RELIGIOUS AND CULTURAL LITERACY AND COMPETENCY IN DISASTER

FEMA's Emergency Management Institute is offering a new self-paced, independent study course 505, Religious and Cultural Literacy and Competency in Disaster. This course explores how religious and cultural communities are engaged during disasters, how religious and cultural diversity and practice is protected by law, and how religious and cultural diversity can strengthen emergency management capabilities. It provides emergency management professionals and faith and community leaders active in disaster with literacy and competency tools to engage religious and cultural groups both pre- and post-disaster. The course also includes 14 downloadable tip sheets that highlight engagement best practices and guidelines for partnering with diverse religious communities.

The course is open to the general public and was developed to support partnerships between the first responders and faith-based and community organizations to more effectively serve disaster survivors in their time of need.
